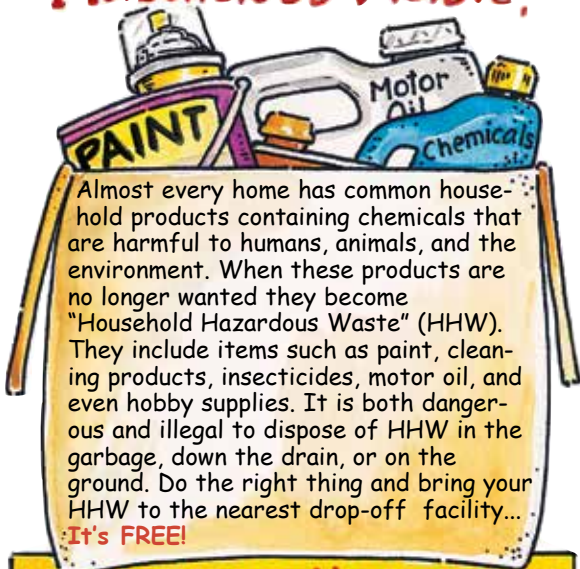


What is Household Hazardous Waste?



Almost every home has common household products containing chemicals that are harmful to humans, animals, and the environment. When these products are no longer wanted they become "Household Hazardous Waste" (HHW). They include items such as paint, cleaning products, insecticides, motor oil, and even hobby supplies. It is both dangerous and illegal to dispose of HHW in the garbage, down the drain, or on the ground. Do the right thing and bring your HHW to the nearest drop-off facility... **It's FREE!**

UNWANTED PAINT RECYCLE PROGRAM



Each year thousands of gallons of paint are left over from home improvement projects. If handled improperly, paint threatens the environment, wildlife, and human health. So bring your leftover latex or oil-based paint to the HHW drop-off facility.

If you have less than 2 inches of paint left in a container, open the lid and let the paint dry. After the paint is dry you may throw away the whole container in the trash.

- *Antifreeze-In a sealed plastic container
- *Auto Batteries
- *Household Batteries
- *Fluorescent Tubes & Compact Bulbs - 10 per visit
- *Ballasts-10 per visit



Recycle Motor Oil

*MOTOR OIL & Oil Filters-Place drained filters in a plastic zip-lock bag and use City provided container for oil. Never mix used motor oil with antifreeze, transmission fluid, gasoline, or other contaminants.

Absolutely NO Solvents!

OIL & OIL FILTER CURBSIDE RECYCLING!

Put used oil in City of Santa Cruz 2 1/2 gallon container. Place drained filters in zip-lock bag. Leave both next to blue recycling cart and not inside cart.

To receive a Free 2 1/2 gallon used-oil container and schedule a pickup call 420-5220.

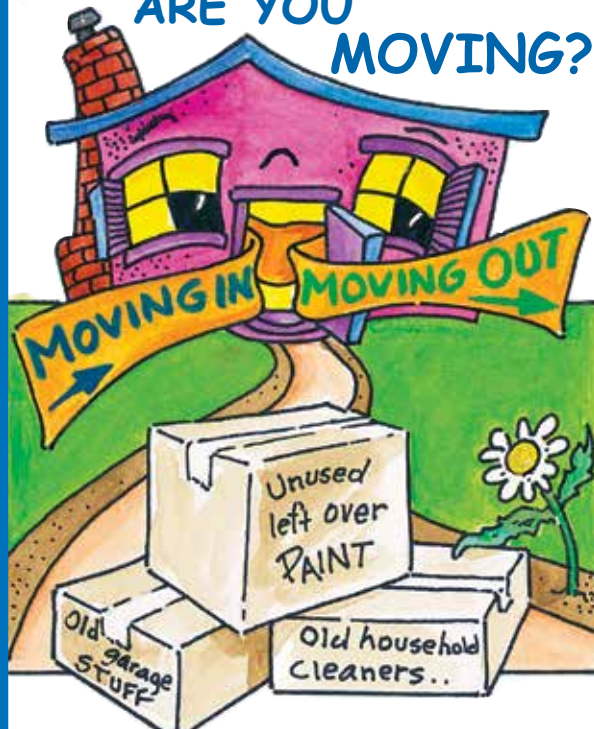
CLEAN UP WITH CARE

- Look for the least toxic products available.
- Clean latex paint in a sink connected to the sanitary sewer.
- Reuse solvents and thinners when cleaning oil-based paint.
- Never clean equipment in gutters, streets, or storm drains.

ARE YOU MOVING?



Before you move, take proper care of household products that may contain hazardous ingredients.

Make sure these products are **REUSED, RECYCLED, or PROPERLY DISPOSED.**

HERE'S WHAT YOU CAN DO!

SET ASIDE products that you can use up before you move, or that you will personally transport to your new home.

OFFER the remaining products to the new owners, neighbors, or friends.

DROP OFF any remaining Household Hazardous Waste at a collection site near you.

HOMEBOUND PICK-UP

If no one in your household is physically able to bring your HHW material to a facility, call 454-2606 to schedule a pick-up.

Medical Waste & Needles

You can drop off your medications, needles and sharps at several locations. Keep medicine out of our ground water, streams and ocean. Do not pour medication down any drain or flush down the toilet. Our treatment system can't process these chemicals effectively.

- ✓ It is illegal to discard used sharps in the garbage or recycling.
- ✓ Used sharps must be transported in an approved sharps container.

Never throw medical waste in the garbage or recycling cart.

SAFE HANDLING TIPS

- Transport Household Hazardous Waste in the original labeled containers.
- Make sure the lids are on securely and that no containers are leaking.
- Cushion glass containers to prevent breakage.
- Residents may only transport 15 gallons or 125 lbs. of HHW in their vehicle.
- Gasoline & Kerosene must be in an unbreakable container that is leak proof.
