

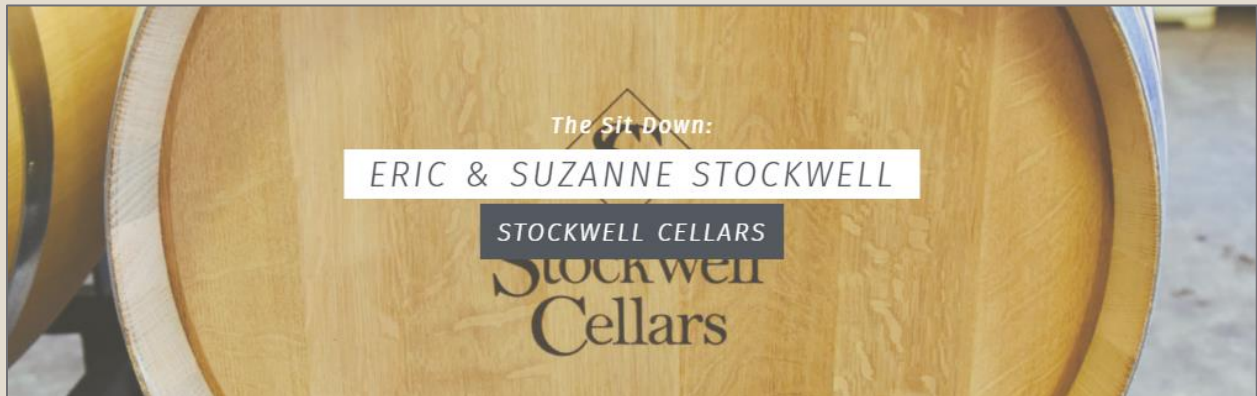

LARGE SCALE MURALS COMPLETED AT WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT



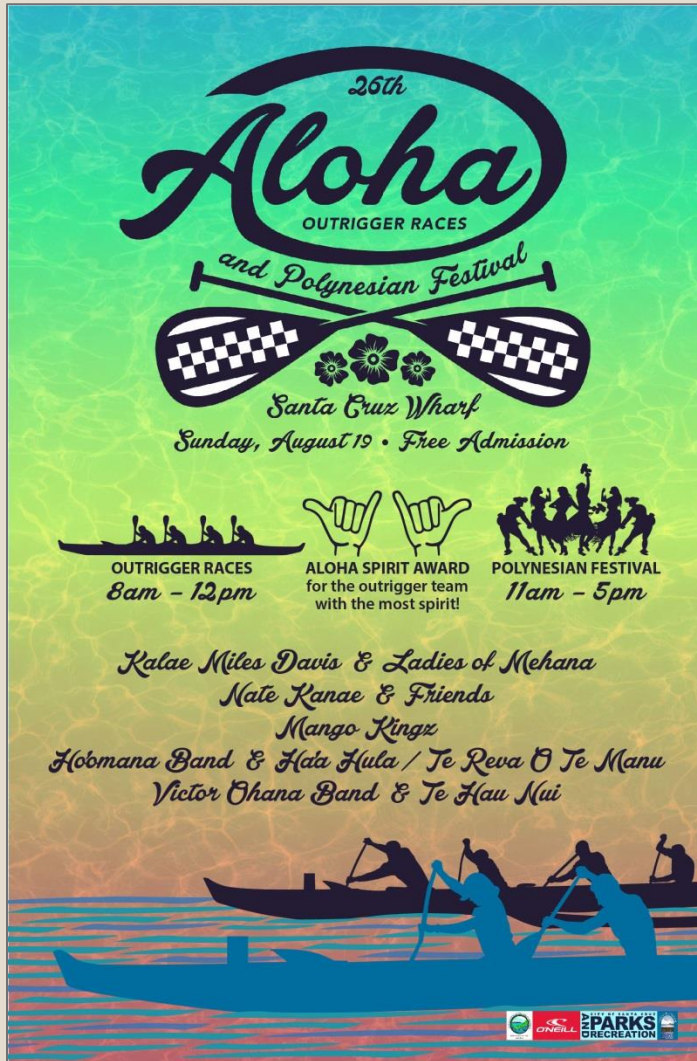
The City of Santa Cruz, Mayor Terrazas and the Santa Cruz Arts Commission celebrated the completion of multiple large-scale murals at the City's award-winning waste water treatment plant, by local artist [Elijah Pfothauer](#) on Wednesday, August 15th.

The murals feature ocean and estuary animals including coho, blue whales, a giant red octopus, egrets and more! Elijah Pfothauer was born in Santa Cruz, California. He studied art at Cabrillo College. His works have been shown at a variety of galleries in the greater Bay Area including: The Hide Gallery, The Mill, Mama Buzz, and 4th Street Triumph. Elijah has also done a variety of murals around Santa Cruz County and Bay Area.

Elijah personally utilizes painting and visual arts to engage and uplift the community. He believes that through the Arts, the public can actively participate in

the transformation of society. This project was approved by the Santa Cruz Arts Commission and funded through the City's 1% for Art Program.

Free Citizenship Workshop August 25th at the Santa Cruz Public Libraries Downtown Branch

Library teams up with International Rescue Committee to offer free one-on-one assistance with the U.S. citizenship application process.



The Santa Cruz Public Library System (SCPL) will host a free Citizenship information session and application workshop at the Downtown Branch Library. The workshop will be conducted by the International Rescue Committee (IRC), who provide accessible immigration resources to the community.

The event begins with a session designed to provide participants with information on the citizenship application process and the eligibility requirements to become an American citizen.

Those who are ready to apply can register in advance for a free on-site one-on-one session with an IRC trained immigration specialist who will help complete and submit the citizenship application (N-400); and file fee waivers on the participant's behalf (if applicable). Afterwards and throughout the entire naturalization process, IRC will follow-up with the status of cases and serve as a representative with USCIS.

According to Director of Libraries Susan Nemitz, the Santa Cruz Public Libraries' collaboration with IRC supports the Library's mission by providing space and information that connects people with resources to empower themselves and strengthen community networks. She says, "Navigating the citizenship process can be overwhelming, and bringing this type of assistance to the community is critical."

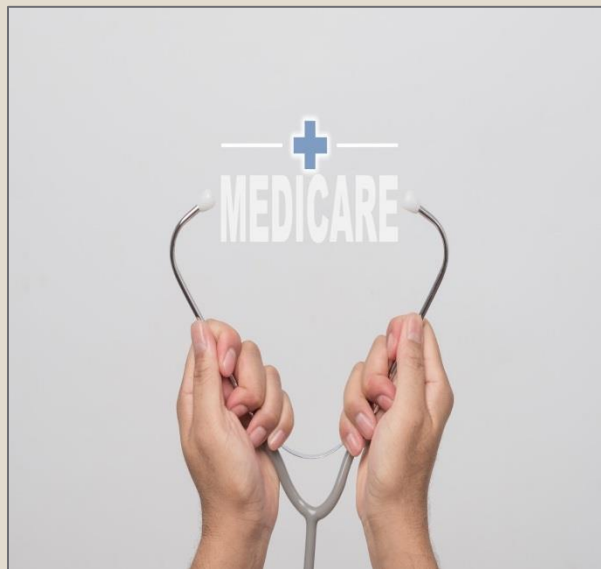

PUBLIC WORKS

Wastewater Treatment Facility

The plant's new [mural](#) was officially unveiled with Mayor Terrazas, City officials and community members on Wednesday, Aug. 15. The ocean and estuary-themed mural by local artist Elijah Pfotenhauer underscores the plant's environmentally-friendly process and is a City of Santa Cruz Arts Commission project. The mural includes colorful panels covering about 400 feet of the plant's driveway walls, extending to heights of 24 feet.



Resource Recovery Operations/Engineering

CEQA documents (Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration) for the Pond Dredging project have been submitted and Notice of Intent to Adopt MND has been sent out. The public comment period is Aug. 16 – Sept 16. Once we have the final CEQA docs and approval from various regulatory agencies (Army Corps, RWQCB, etc.), we can schedule the project to remove accumulated sediments from our North and West Ponds.

Staff submitted the Semi-Annual report to the Monterey Bay Air Pollution Control District per our Title V permit requirements

Traffic Engineering/Community Relations

Our Bay Street Sidewalk Completion Infill Project is expected to begin construction in mid-September. The work to be done includes installation of sidewalks, driveway approaches, curbs and gutters, curb ramps and striping for an ADA compliant/pedestrian friendly system. Construction notices were sent to nearby residents.

The [Street Smarts](#) traffic safety campaign is grateful for the support of the financial and media sponsors below as it begins year 2. Messages begin next week on Comcast digital, KAZU, KSCO and KZSC. Banners are being placed in front of schools and on street poles. New messages are in the works as is a new collaboration with Ecology Action through their Bike Smart/Walk Smart elementary school programs and middle school traffic safety assemblies.

Operations

On Monday, August 20, City contractors will be removing some rooftop mechanical equipment from the roof of the City Hall Annex Building. A large crane will be set up in the parking area north of the Annex to load equipment onto trucks on Locust Street.

To reduce any potential safety risk to the public and City staff from this work, the work will begin at approximately 6 AM. We expect this phase of the work to be completed by 8 AM. The crane will then move to Church Street, which will be closed for the day.

Fairly loud noise should be expected from 6 to 8 AM. Locust Street will be subject to closure and/or traffic control during this period. We thank our neighbors in advance for understanding during this construction and apologize for any inconvenience.
